Logan City Council is improving a 3.8-kilometre section of Chambers Flat Road, from Mount Lindesay Highway (Munruben) to just north of Kings Way (Chambers Flat). This upgrade will deliver a safer and smoother road, with better flood resilience. For more information, visit:

### Cultural heritage management

Following clearing works for the new Norris Creek Bridge in July 2022, cultural artefacts were uncovered within the work area. Activities have been paused while we work with the local Traditional Owners to protect cultural values on site.

We thank the community and road users for their patience while we ensure local cultural significance is managed appropriately. Residents will be notified before works restart.

### Looking forward: reopening of Chambers Flat Road at Norris Creek

With project works unlikely to recommence before the end of the year, traffic will be reopened in both directions from early December 2022. We appreciate the feedback the community has provided in relation to the closure. We are pleased to bring this change whilst we respond to the cultural heritage matters on site.

The single direction road closure will be reinstated when the project recommences. We will advise the community and road users in advance of any future changes.

### Drone technology

Is it a bird? Is it a plane? No, it's a survey drone! From time to time, you may notice drones in use above the work zone. Drone technology allows accurate mapping of ground levels along the project corridor and data collection to map, calculate and track materials. ## New homes for wildlife



As part of our commitment to protecting local ecological values, we've installed 39 nest box homes for a range of species including kookaburras, wood ducks, lorikeets, pythons, and possums. Nest boxes provide habitat for wildlife and help to replace trees removed for the widening of Chambers Flat Road.
