YOUR COLLECTION DAY AND WEEK

HOW TO PLACE YOUR BIN ON THE KERB

Bins should:

- > Be a maximum of 1 m from the kerb
- > Have handles facing your property and the opening facing the street
- > Be out before 6 am on day of collection
- > Not be overfull – lids must close fully
- > Where possible place clear of cars, trees and all other obstacles
- > Trucks can only lift bins with a maximum weight of 70 kg. Even moderate amounts of sand, soil, rocks, plant seeds, grass clippings and the like can cause it to become overweight.



**THE FOLLOWING ITEMS CAN GO
IN THE RECYCLING BIN**



Steel and aluminium cans including aerosols.



Glass bottles and jars.



Paper and cardboard, including: newspaper, magazines, boxes and milk and juice cartons. Flatten boxes and cartons.



Rigid plastic food packaging and bottles from the kitchen, bathroom and laundry.



**Do not bag recyclables.
Place them in bin loose.**

Organic waste such as garden waste and food scraps can also be composted.

Batteries



Oil and paint



Rocks



Gas bottles



Medical waste



Building materials



Chemicals and pesticides



Soil and stumps

Unless generated by an occupant of the house and placed in a puncture-proof container before disposal.

Trucks can only lift bins with a maximum weight of 70 kg. Bins containing even moderate quantities of sand, soil, rocks, plant seeds, grass clippings and the like can easily become overweight. **Contact Council regarding the correct disposal of these items.**

THE FOLLOWING CAN GO IN THE GREEN BIN



Palm fronds



Grass clippings



Weeds



Prunings from shrubs and trees



Up to 10 cm in diameter and 75 cm in length.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS CAN NOT GO IN THE GREEN BIN



Plastic bags



Nappies (including compostable nappies)



Garden hoses or tools



Hazardous waste



General waste



Large logs, branches and stumps



Plant pots



Batteries or chemicals



Kitchen waste (including fruit, vegetable and meat scraps)



Rocks and building materials



Green waste should not be put into bags. Line your bin with newspaper if needed.

You can take large volumes of green waste to one of our waste and recycling facilities.



If your property has a bin collection service, you can order a green waste bin. Residential and commercial property owners and tenants can apply by scanning the QR code or visiting logan.qld.gov.au/greenwastebin.

SIMPLE WAYS TO MINIMISE WASTE

Every Logan resident produces approximately one tonne of waste each year with much of this waste ending up at the local landfill.

Avoiding, reducing, reusing and recycling are more sustainable waste management options than waste disposal.



Here are a few tips to help you minimise your waste:

- > Put a 'No Junk Mail' sticker on your letterbox.
- > Say 'No' to plastic bags by using reusable alternatives.
- > Avoid impulse purchases.
- > Borrow or share infrequently used items.
- > Read newspapers online and borrow books from the library.
- > Buy in bulk where possible.
- > Buy for durability not disposability.
- > Buy refills and refillable products.
- > Don't buy items with excessive packaging.
- > Swap magazines and books.
- > Print double-sided.
- > Reuse plastic bottles and takeaway containers.
- > Reuse bags as bin liners.
- > Reuse envelopes as shopping lists.
- > Have a garage sale or donate unwanted goods to charity.
- > Use the kerbside recycling service.
- > Place all your fruit and vegetable scraps and garden waste in a compost bin or worm farm.
