Construction Update

Chambers Flat Road Upgrade

July 2024

SEE Civil is the appointed contractor to construct the 3.8 km Chambers Flat Road upgrade between Mount Lindesay Highway to just north of Kings Way.

Construction Activities – Final Stages

Zone 1 Ambulance Station to Norris Creek Road

Zone 2 - 1866 to 1737 Chambers Flat Road

The project is now in its final stages. Finishing works will continue over the coming weeks, including:

- > constructing driveways
- > topsoiling and landscaping
- > installing road signs and line marking
- > constructing drainage and batters
- > asphalting and sealing
- > installing remaining fencing.

During eastbound lane construction in Zone 1 and 2, residents' bins (on the northern side) will be serviced from the westbound lane.

Zone 1 and Zone 4 - asphalt replacement

Following compliance testing in Zones 1 and 4, some sections of asphalt did not meet the required quality standards and will be replaced. This ensures the new road meets the intended design life well into the future.

What happens next?

From Monday, 1 July, sections of asphalt in the western lane will be removed for replacement. Activities involve profiling, pavement sealing, and re-asphalting. The work will take approximately a week, including curing of the new surface.

To allow for this work, Zone 1 traffic will switch temporarily to the new eastbound lane. In Zone 4, three-way traffic lights will be temporarily installed to allow a replacement of pavement at the intersection.

When all works are complete, the one-way detour from Norris Creek bridge to Munruben Ambulance Station will be removed. The upgraded lanes will open both ways between Kings Way and Mt Lindesay Highway.

Zone 3 - Norris Creek bridge opening

Wednesday 29 May marked a significant milestone with the new western lane opened to traffic at the Norris Creek bridge.

This achievement comes after nearly 18 months of challenges, extreme wet weather, and other hurdles. The community now benefits from improved safety and flood resilience at this critical east-west connection.



Final bridge works will include:

- > widening the embankments to final design
- > rock pitching under the bridge to reduce erosion
- > completing drainage
- > asphalting and line marking
- > installing road signs and lighting
- > landscaping.

The temporary westbound diversion remains in place until the eastbound lane is opened.





Zone 3 - Greenvale Road intersection

Greenvale Road intersection upgrade is well underway and will continue over the coming weeks*.

From Thursday 27 June 2024, road users entering Greenvale Road switched onto a new alignment, accessing the left turn lane on leaving the bridge.

Until works are complete, Greenvale Road entry and exit will be via single lane traffic arrangements with temporary traffic signals in place. Traffic controllers will assist motorists during work hours.

Please be aware of site activities and comply with directions, signs, and posted speed limits.

Zone 4 1545 Chambers Flat Road to **Riverina Court**



Zone 4 final works include:

- driveway construction and sealing
- installation of road signage and line marking
- electrical works near Kings Way
- defect repairs to asphalt.

What to expect

- > temporary traffic changes including reduced speed
- traffic directions to move machinery and materials
- frequent changes to lane and road alignments
- odour during asphalting and sealing works
- increased truck movements
- temporary property access changes
- increased noise, dust, and vibration.

Weather and construction conditions may impact scheduled work hours.
