

# Loganlea Road Major Upgrade

Project update, December 2024

SEE Civil on behalf of Logan City Council is undertaking 2.3kms of widening works from University Drive at Meadowbrook to the Pacific Motorway/M1 at Slacks Creek.

## Progress update

The project is now in its final stages, targeting completion in early 2025, site and weather conditions permitting.

### Upcoming finishing works include:

- > central median and final stages of the new southbound lane and line marking
- > guardrail, fauna and residential fencing installation
- > intersection works at Ellerslie Road, University Drive, Golf Course Drive, Queens Road and Nujooloo Road
- > final stages of drainage infrastructure
- > lighting and traffic signal electrical works
- > landscaping and new signage
- > permanent driveway works at the Shell service station entrance
- > the additional third lane will open in the new year in both directions.

## Ray Hodgson Bridge

The project has reached another significant milestone with the completion of Ray Hodgson Bridge improvement works.

The upgrades include widening the bridge to add a new northbound lane, strengthening it to support heavier vehicles, and creating a new shared path.

Changes have been made also to the shared footpaths on both sides of the bridge. Please follow all direction signs.

The new bridgeworks are now open to traffic and pedestrians.

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## Emergency vehicles take priority

Thousands of movements occur daily through the intersection at Eilerslie Road, Loganlea Road, and University Drive by cars, trucks, cyclists and pedestrians.

Traffic signals at this busy location are managed by under-road sensors and automatic timers.

When ambulances and other emergency vehicles approach the traffic lights on Loganlea Road, they can override normal signal sequencing. The green light is held for a faster response to urgent calls. This results in extra waiting time on the side roads.

Once they have passed, the traffic lights return to normal sequencing after a couple of light cycles.

This situation will continue to occur following completion of the upgrade because of the proximity of Logan Hospital and access to the M1 and Logan motorways.



## What can I expect?

- > Temporary traffic changes – expect detours, please follow signs and directions
- > Odour during asphaltting and sealing works
- > Increased truck movements
- > Temporary changes to property access
- > Increased noise, dust, and vibration
- > Watering down areas for dust control
- > Drone flights to capture progress and assist engineering
- > Intermittent night works until the end of the project to help reduce delays during peaks
- > Temporary materials stockpiling
